International Women's Day & Sacred People Sacred Earth Day

On March 11th we gathered at the Mercy Hub for the 'Choose to Challenge' afternoon tea, to celebrate International Women's Day and Sacred People Sacred Earth Day. We were joined by captivating speakers, Sr. Angela Reed and Buddhist nun Ayya Yeshe, to explore topics of gender equity, environmental crisis, and how these two pertinent issues intersect. Guests included students from Mercy schools, Sisters, Young Mercy Links members, African migrants, the Carlton community and friends.

Sr. Angela highlighted the importance of International Women's Day for achieving social, political, and structural transformation and discussed the works of Mercy Global Action. Angela asked our guests, "Which significant women would you want to invite to a dinner party?", we received responses such as climate activist Greta Thunberg, New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern, and Indigenous woman, sports person and former politician Nova Peris. Ayya Yeshe expressed that addressing women rights is also addressing the climate crisis and that to effect change we need to move out of our intellect and into our heart centre. Ayya discussed how we can be present with the needs of our world and how to avoid spiritual bypassing. She asked us, "Is our spiritual practice one of justice, compassion, and embodied spirituality?".

Palm Sunday - Walk for Justice for Refugees

From everyone at the Mercy Hub we wish you a happy Eastertide!

On Sunday March 28th Young Mercy Links members along with others from Our Lady of Mercy College Heidelberg and the Hub community attended the annual Walk for Justice for Refugees. At the State Library we were addressed by moving and inspiring speakers who reminded us of the human face behind Australia's asylum seeker policies. Julian Burnside spoke to us of The Tampa incident and how he became involved with the plight of refugees and fighting for human rights. Sr Bridget Arthur (from the Bridgidine Asylum Seeker Project) spoke about the awful state of limbo that released refugees, who are on temporary visas, find themselves in- unable to work, enrol in university or access Medicare. Moz, a Medivac refugee, just recently released, spoke to us about his message of love and how the support of Australians gave him real hope. He sang an Australian classic- 'I am Australian' altering a few lines to sing- "A refugee, now a free man, I am Australian". After the speakers we chanted as we walked the city streets ending up at a hotel where some asylum seekers are still being held indefinitely. They shone lights out the windows and waved to us, so grateful for our support. The afternoon provided great opportunity for reflection and definitely inspired a call to action. Hopefully they heard us up the steps of Parliament house!
